thrilled to meet you, humbled to experience the rich and difficult history of Vietnam with you, and ready to make this a trip you will never forget!



JUNE 2024 05, Wednesday & 06, Thursday Depart Grand Rapids

Today's the day! We meet at Hope College for our transfer to Chicago for our connecting flights to Vietnam. While in the air, we cross the International Dateline, losing a day. (meals in-flight)

07, Friday Arrive in Hanoi

Welcome to Vietnam! After a long journey, we collect our luggage and meet our driver and guide for our transfer to the hotel where we have time to refresh and explore before our group dinner at a local restaurant this evening. (D)

08, Saturday <mark>Hanoi</mark>

We have the morning to continue exploring Hanoi before we have the opportunity to take a Cyclo trip around the Old Quarter. Seated in the front carriage of bikes, you'll be immersed in the exciting and bustling city. There is time to look around for souvenirs with the many shops in town. Following, we visit Hoa Lo prison, which was built by the French and used during the Indochina War. The prison was used not only to house Vietnamese patriots, it was later used during the war to hold American pilots that were shot down. We have time to walk through the museum, learning about its complex history through its displays. This afternoon we visit the Peace House Project before having the rest of the day at leisure. (B, L)

09, Sunday Ninh Binh, Hanoi

Early this morning we get picked up at the hotel by our guide to depart for Ninh Binh province with breaks to stop and stretch our legs. Upon arriving, we visit Hoa Lu', the ancient capital of Vietnam between 968 and 1010. While here we learn about the history of the Vietnamese feudal system under different dynasties. Following, we explore Thung Nham Bird Garden. This popular garden lets us immerse in the wild environment with must-see friendly native birds. This afternoon we have time to relax in the local village before we return to Hanoi for an independent evening. (B, L)



10, Monday Lao Cai, Sapa

This morning we visit one of Hanoi's Buddhist temples before starting our drive to Sapa. With breaks to stretch, explore, and have an independent lunch en route, we stop in Phu Tho Province and Lao Cai before arriving. (B, D)

11, Tuesday Cat Cat Village, Ha Giang

Take a visit to Cat Cat Village, home of the Black H'Mong people. Surrounded by mountains, and terraced farms, we continue exploring the village's natural beauty by cooling off at the Cat Cat Waterfall. While in the village, we visit the local H'Mong families to learn about their captivating culture. This afternoon we drive to Ha Giang Province. (B, L)







We transfer to Dong Van, stopping in Yen Minh to explore another local village before continuing our drive. Right before arriving, we stop outside of the district center to visit the Vuong family house. The home once belonged to the King of H'Mong ethnic people. The building's highly impressive architecture represents the ancient value of the Chinese. Upon arriving in Dong Van, we enter the Dong Van Geopark. Due to its stunning landscapes paired with the colorful traditional clothing of ethnic minority people, Dong Van is a paradise full of photo opportunities. Being Vietnam's first Global Geopark, we lookout into one of the most rugged yet amazing landscapes in Vietnam. (B, D)

13, Thursday Lung Cu, Ma Pi Leng, Ha Giang

Today's adventures bring us into the highest mountains of Dong Van, where we see the Lung Cu Flag Tower Pole, a significant landmark for the Vietnamese people. This area is the northernmost point in the country. Following, we drive back to Ha Giang city, stopping along the way to Ma Pi Leng as well as seeing H'Mong sites. We check into our hotel and have the afternoon at leisure. (B, L)

14, Friday <mark>Hanoi</mark>

Driving back to Hanoi today, we check into our hotel upon arriving and have the rest of the day to unwind after full days of adventure! (B, L)



15, Saturday Hue, DMZ, Da Nang

This morning, we have an early departure to the Hanoi Airport for our flight to Hue. After arriving, we drive to the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) which is the area around the former border between North and South Vietnam. While here, we visit La Vang Holy Land, which has a Cathedral and the battlefield of Khe Sanh on historic Route 9. We also see Rock Pile Hill, a well-known site along Route 9. We continue to the Khe Sanh combat base next. Khe Sanh is a base camp attacked by the North Vietnamese Army in 1968. This afternoon, we arrive at our hotel and have a group dinner this evening. (B, D)





16, Sunday My Lai, Da Nang

After breakfast, we visit the My Lai Massacre site which sheds light on the horrific events of the Vietnam War. A sobering experience, we will see the Lai Massacre Memorial and Museum before visiting Hoi An and driving back to our hotel in Da Nang. (B, L)

17, Monday Ho Chi Minh (Saigon)

We visit the Center for Agent Orange Victims in Da Nang before transferring to the airport for our afternoon flight to Ho Chi Minh. After arriving, we check into our hotel to refresh before our group dinner this evening. (B, D)



18, Tuesday Cu Chi Tunnels, Ho Chi Minh

With an early departure, we get picked up at the hotel and depart to Cu Chi Tunnels. Along the way, we visit with a local family as they teach us how to make authentic rice paper. After arriving, we have a short introduction including a video about the construction and use of the tunnels during the war. Following, we get to spend time exploring the remaining tunnel system which includes living areas with kitchens and bedrooms. They even constructed weapon factories, field hospitals, and command centers, showing how people were able to survive in the tunnels. The rest of the evening is independent to explore the amazing city of Ho Chi Minh and pick a local restaurant for dinner. (B, L)

19, Wednesday Ho Chi Minh City

After visiting Thao Dan Project Center, we explore the Reunification Palace and War Museum's historically significant sites. The afternoon is at leisure, use the time to unwind from a full week, or snag your last couple of souvenirs to remember your time in Vietnam before our group dinner this evening. (B, D)

20, Thursday <mark>Return Home</mark>

This morning is independent until we transfer to the Ho Chi Minh Airport for our departing flight home. (B)
